## SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION

In honor of the late Dr. Ella White-Campbell, the Randallstown Branch of the NAACP has established a scholarship fund for high school seniors. Dr. Ella White-Campbell, a trail blazer, scholar, educator, and a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., was a community leader for many years in Baltimore County with a focus on the Liberty Road Corridor. A leader in the field of education, Dr. White-Campbell was appointed as a Department Head and later promoted to the position of Assistant Principal. She designed a special curriculum which increased the test scores of hundreds of students in Baltimore City. Many of these students became very successful scholars.

In honor of Dr. Barbara Dezmon, the Randallstown Branch of the NAACP has established a scholarship fund for high school seniors. Dr. Dezmon served as Executive Assistant to the Deputy Superintendent and Assistant to the Superintendent for Equity and Assurance in Baltimore County Public Schools. Her prior work experience included classroom teaching, administration, professional development, and parent, community, and business relations.
