This year has been challenging in many ways, but together we remained committed to helping our community. The Randallstown NAACP has had the following accomplishments in 2023:

Education:

- Advocated for Educational Options for black students in Baltimore County Schools,
- Advocated for better schools and different ways to improve the school system,
- Created a scholarship with the McDonald's of New Town specifically for New Town High School,
- Gave over \$4,000 dollars in scholarships to Baltimore County Public Students,
- Worked with different Community Schools in Baltimore County.

Economic Development:

- Instrumental in bringing in the Grocery Outlet to Liberty Road and Owings Mills,
- Instrumental in bringing in an Applebee's to Owings Mills,
- Instrumental in bringing in the Raising Cane restaurant to Owings Mills,
- Created a Liberty Road Task Force and published a 22-page report on revitalizing Liberty Road,
- Held a meeting with elected officials on the urgency of redevelopment on Liberty Road,
- Supported the West Baltimore County Redevelopment Authority,
- In talks with a grocery store chain to fill the Old Shoppers Building on Liberty Road,
- Work with Walmart to have the Randallstown store renovated to include self-checkout machines in 2024,
- Advocated for Baltimore County to purchase parts of Security Mall,
- Advocated for a new Panda Express at Security Mall,
- Helped to relocate homeless individuals around Security Mall,
- Created a New Town Shopping Center Task Force and report,
- Worked and continue to work to bring a grocery store to New Town Shopping Center,
- Advocated for a better mix of stores at Mill Station,
- Advocated for upgrades to a park/ice rink at Mill Station,
- Advocated and worked to bring in a new hotel at Metro Center,

- Advocated to have the lightning increased and the trash picked up at the Catonsville Walmart,
- Started the customer service initiative to ensure black residents are treated like everyone else,
- Advocated for Legislation to curb Dollar Stores, Gas Stations, Storage Buildings that have over saturated our community.

Crime:

- Advocated and worked with the Baltimore County Police and Code Enforcement to eliminate Tracker Trailer parking on Milford Mill Road, Church Lane, Fairbrook Road, and Laurel Drive,
- Worked with the Chief of Police on increasing diversity and equitable policing,
- Continued to expand our relationship with the Baltimore County Police Department to increase community policing,
- Advocated for systemic changes to the Department of Parole and Probation ensuring individuals are monitored properly and given the resources to be successful,
- Advocated for Department of Juvenile Services to ensure they are protecting the public by holding juveniles accountable and give the proper resources,
- Created a coalition to interrupt loitering and crime at New Town Shopping Center (calls for service and crime is down),
- Work closely with the police department to interrupt street racing at Security Mall and other areas.
